



The Way Forward - Conclusions and Outlook

TCA-Description

Recent developments in politics and societies in Europe and on a global level have shown that the perception of mutual exchange as well as joint project cooperation currently undergo substantive changes. Longstanding cooperations and traditional mobility flows must be complemented with new partners and a new vision about European cooperation. A huge potential for this lies in the cooperation with Southeast European partners. In terms of exploring new concepts of mobility cooperation, not only in- and outbound flows will be taken into consideration but also intra-regional flows as well as blended mobility formats. By figuring out new ways and types of cooperation with Southeast European countries, linguistic, socioeconomic, and political difficulties, which impeded the progress of fostering intra-regional cooperation and created obstacles for students to go abroad will be addressed. By considering already existing partnerships between and with Southeast European countries in the field of higher education we make use of synergies and pre-existing knowledge in this field.

Workshop-Descriptions

Workshop 1:

Mobility (KA1) - How to increase mobilities to Southeastern Europe: New concepts for networking

<u>Speakers & Moderation:</u> Ivana Balšić, NA Serbia & Mimika Dobroshi, NEO Kosovo, Michaela Lanaro, National Agency Germany (NA DAAD)

Description:

Now that travel restrictions from the COVID-pandemic are finally lifted, international mobility is in high demand. In this workshop we will look into ideas on increasing mobilities between Germany and neighouring countries and Southeastern Europe. We will identify obstacles and challenges and explore ressources to develop longstanding cooperations and steady mobility numbers.

Goal:

Networking, identifying challenges regarding mobility flows and find solutions trough peer-learning and exchange.

Workshop 2:

Mobility (KA1) - Blended Intensive Programmes: Potentials & Hurdles

<u>Speakers & Moderation:</u> Raluca Boldan & Simona Alexianu, National Agency Romania, Tijana Funk, National Agency Germany (NA DAAD)

<u>Description:</u> Since the introduction of Blended Intensive Programmes in the current Erasmus+ programme generation (2021-2027), they have been a great asset but pose certain challenges to the universities.

In this workshop regulations on Blended Intensive Programmes will be briefly presented, as well as potentials and challenges. Also, the Romanian National Agency will talk about the demand for Blended Intensive Programmes in their country, problems they encountered and how they solved them.

<u>Goal:</u> Overview of Blended Intensive Programmes, establishing contact with potential partners.

Workshop 3:

Cooperation Projects (KA2/KA3) – How to initiate a project and how to write a competitive proposal

<u>Speakers & Moderation:</u> Markus Christoph Engert, Technical University of Applied Sciences Würzburg-Schweinfurt & Dr. Marie Vanderbeke, Ruhr University Bochum, Carina Fazius, National Agency Germany (NA DAAD)

<u>Description:</u> Writing a project proposal does not only require professional expertise and a good project idea. It is also important to meet the formal requirements of an EU application. The session will show which criteria are important in the context of an EU application to increase the chances of EU selection and funding. Furthermore, experiences on initiating a project and applying successfully for cooperation projects in higher education will be shared.

<u>Goal:</u> Expand knowledge on project initiation and writing a successful project proposal, exchange experiences with other participants.

Workshop 4:

Cooperation Projects (KA2/KA3) - How to successfully manage a project consortium with a focus on Southeastern Europe

<u>Speakers & Moderation:</u> Dr. Mareike Fröhlich LL.M., Saarland University & Prof. Dr. Neda Zdraveva, Ss. Cyrill and Methodius University in Skopje

<u>Description:</u> Cooperation projects funded under Erasmus+ (Key Action 2 and 3) with its international or European consortia entail special challenges. The workshop which has its focus on Southeastern Europe will deal with a number of questions and will try to find answers to them. These start with the formation of a consortium, the identification of different problem areas and the search for appropriate solutions. Consortium structures, written/verbal agreements, communication channels, cultural differences and practical considerations will be discussed. In particular, the workshop is also intended to provide an opportunity to share experiences and identify best practices.

<u>Goal:</u> Peer-learning and exchange, identifying challenges and find appropriate solutions in the context of consortia structures, networking.
