

EU Democracy Roleplay

Aim: To educate fellow students on how the three legislative EU institutions work and how European democracy works and how it passes law

The European Commission:

- Elect a leader
- Make a legislative proposal, regarding the issue and how to solve it
 When it feels ready, send it to the European Parliament and the European Council

The European Parliament:

- Elect a leader
- Join/ create a political group
- Present your arguments (1min)
- Vote yes or no, needs a 60% majority

The European Council:

- They decide if they approve of the proposed legislation if it passes through parliament

If all institutions agree that the proposed legislation is approved, then it will be European Union law!

The Commission and Council (20-ish) will vote for a political group to make up the parliament (10-ish)

Responsible: The European Commission is responsible for proposing legislation and then passing them Into European law if they are approved by the European Parliament and Council.	Responsible: The European Parliament is a collection of 705 people that are responsible for representing the people that elected them. Ergo, the citizens of the EU. They vote to approve or disapprove of laws proposed by the Commission.	Responsible: The European Council is responsible for reviewing legislative proposals when approved by the European Parliament. It consists of the top EU leaders and they set the political agenda for the European Union.
