This thematic seminar with networking activities is aimed at training organisation (or organisation/authorities who manages their mobilities via consortia) in the medical and paramedical sectors, from EQF level 3 to 8, which are active in the Erasmus+ programme. In France, these courses can be divided into 2 main categories: University health courses: medicine, dental, midwifery, pharmacy Paramedical training: nurse, hospital porter, physiotherapist, health care assistant, pharmacy assistants, rescuer/ambulance crew, health care assistants etc.
