<b>Themes and goals:</b>	<p>New generations of European farmers face numerous challenges: climate-related (mitigation and adaptation), environmental (agroecological transition), societal (animal welfare, organic and local food), economic, and demographic challenges, linked to workforce renewal, European food sovereignty, and the preservation of the European model of family farming. These issues – threats, but also opportunities – lie at the heart of the concerns and strategies of the European Commission and EU member states. The TCA should promote the development of new Erasmus+ partnership projects that deliver a European added value and achieve outcomes to address these issues.</p>
<b>Expected results:</b>	<p>Supporting institutions in setting up European partnership projects under Erasmus+ KA2 (KA210 and KA220) for vocational education and training or higher education sectors. Building participants' expertise on issues related to the training of future European agricultural workers to address the challenges of climate change, generational renewal, and agroecological transitions. Sharing best educational practices from European institutions on education for these transitions.</p>
