This change is the result of increasing mobility, globalisation and conflict-driven displacement, and has required adaptation at many levels of society. Some national curriculums have made noteworthy efforts to tailor to a more

multilingual, multicultural and pluriliterate student population, while others are yet to take the leap. With this TCA, the National Agency Erasmus+ provides a platform for discussion on suitable educational approaches for migrant and refugee children in terms of language, curriculum, European/global citizenship, inclusion and the needs for the 21st century primary classroom. Serving as a backdrop for the discussion is a local case study from The Hague, Netherlands,



where a public school enriched the national curriculum with the International Baccalaureate's (IB) Primary Years Programme (PYP). Situated in one of the most complex and diverse neighbourhoods in the city, the school became a learning hub for education in underserved communities. The inquiry-based, transdisciplinary curriculum framework is proving to be a welcome transition to more student-centred, inclusive education.
