Facts about the Youth Sector

The Youth Field is Diverse

- Experienced and established organisations vs. youth led groups
- Professional organisations vs. voluntary organisations
- Youth work is either recognised or not recognised in the society
- How to reach all the people working on youth field?



Numbers of Activities and Participants in Finland 2014-1019

- Finland hosted 32 activities
- Finland sent participants to 373 activities
- Number of applications to TCA activities hosted in Finland 6361
- Number of applications from Finland to activities abroad 1646
- Number of Finnish participants in TCA activities in Finland and abroad 1784



Structural Elements Supporting Quality in TCA

Self-organisation of the Youth NA Network

- Direct and honest communication with COM since the beginning of youth programmes since late 80's
 - Creation of TCP (Training and Cooperation Plan) in 2000
 - Creation of SALTOs in 2000
- Collegial meetings, trainings and working groups
 - TCP Meeting -> TCA Meeting -> TCA/NET Meeting
 - Staff Training (KMST Group)
 - TCA Working Group

Support Measures Created for the Network

- salto-youth.net
 - Extensive amount of youth work related information and homepages of each SALTO
 - NA pages (KMST plan, TCA WG minutes, contact information, logos...
 - European Training Calendar (ETC)
 - Planning Board (PB)
 - Trainers Online for Youth (TOY database)
- TCA/NET Almanac
- TCA/NET Check list

Fundamental Elements in TCA Content Building

Shared Understanding of What TCA is for

- A flexible tool
- Respect for common rules and working ways
- Respect for national realities
- Willingness to cooperate for a common cause
- Responsibility for continuous development
 - New topics
 - Practices and working ways



Need-Based Approach

- National needs vs. common needs on European level
- Needs collected from different sources
 - Applications: quality development needs of applicants
 - Topical themes on national/European level
 - COM & Heads of NAs meetings priorities of the programme
 - Surveys, questionnaires, consultations, feedback
 - "Gut feeling"

Different Levels of Strategic Planning

- Long-term approach
 - Top-down: strategically developed partnerships on programme priority elements (NA Strategic Partnerships)
 - Bottom-up: a larger challenge that requires deeper cooperation and more activities
 - Network trainings: repeatable modules
- Reactions to European phenomena
 - "One off" activities
 - Working "in batches" leading to a more strategic approach

Partnerships

- Excellent opportunities to learning and getting better in your job
- Different levels of involvement in project development
 - Sending Hosting: Trust in the work of colleagues in other countries
 - NA involvement in specific topics (work plan)
 - Different work loads of TCA officers different roles of TCA Officers
- Coordination and Steering Groups
 - Attempts to coordinate larger entities or reoccuring trainings

Effects – Follow-Up

- Feedback and evaluation
 - From each activity
 - Collected nationally
- Effects/Impact difficult to see
 - New applicants
 - New topics in projects
 - Policy development?
- Follow-up activities to create impact
