
Goal, Expected outcomes, Methodology

- Teamwork in 4 groups (4 tables) **Table hosts are needed – Monika Held, Ingrid Gran,....,...**




Expected learning outcomes of the course

The structure of the course




Training programme (draft)



- **Module I (Context)**
 - Presentation of the survey 'Taking stock'
Preliminary task: gathering those document(s) of their own TCA/NA, which can contain strategic goals;
 - The process of the strategic planning
- **Module II**
Participants using their own TCA/NA strategy documents, identify development goals that can be the basis for prospective TCA projects. Then they model a needs' analysis
 - Design of learning outcomes (LOs)
- **Module III**
Participants define the expected results in LOs that can prove the achievement of the goal selected in the previous task.

Planning an action plan

- Draft an action plan (what practical steps need to be taken to achieve the goals)

Possible tasks for the hosts

- Presenting their own good practices at all stages
- Encouraging participants to share their good practices at all stages of the groupworks
